First **international steering committee meeting** for a consultative process on an International Mechanism of Scientific Expertise on Biodiversity. This initiative, called **IMoSEB**, follows-up on the Paris international conference "Biodiversity: Science and Governance" (January 2005) and on the call made by the French president J. Chirac at that conference. The incentive to explore a new mechanism of scientific expertise on biodiversity was supported both by the Paris and the DIVERSITAS Oaxaca conferences' participants. The executive secretariat for the IMoSEB consultation will be ensured by D. Babin of the IFB (Institut Français de la Biodiversité) and A. Larigauderie of DIVERSITAS. The 18 month consultation will be chaired by M. Loreau (Canada, current chair SC- DIVERSITAS) and A. Oteng Yeboah (Ghana, former chair SBSTTA). [more...](#)

Raffaelli**, as representatives of **bioSUSTAINABILITY** and **DIVERSITAS**, will attend the conference. Representatives from NGOs, botanical and mycological societies, research institutions, the UK government and statutory agencies have been invited to attend the meeting, which will consist of presentations summarising progress towards the objectives of Plant Diversity Challenge, supported by papers on each of the 16 targets. The conference will also present the opportunity to discuss future challenges for the conservation of plants and fungi, and how these can be met by 2010.

Workshop: Synergy between Carbon Management and Biodiversity Conservation in Tropical Rain Forests. This 2nd workshop aimed to disseminate the concept of synergy between carbon management and biodiversity conservation in production forests. The Kyoto Protocol incorporates the vital role of forests and wetlands in its mechanisms to reduce greenhouse gases, favouring fast growing plantations. The Convention on Biological Diversity (CBD) emphasizes the conservation and sustainable use of forest and wetlands that harbour biological diversity. Guidelines need to be developed to deal with these mutually exclusive requirements. [more...](#)
